They meet their extended family-- a loving grandma, a cool aunt or uncle, a cousin the same age who becomes a best friend.

They learn the culture and see the sights-- exploring the city, the traditions and rituals, the nature and wildlife through the eyes of the locals.

They connect with their past— hearing stories of their parents' childhood and visiting the places their parents played and went to school.

They do it on their own-- without their parents, outside of their comfort zone. And we capture every heart-warming, humorous, and life-changing detail on camera.





With the entire world as our canvas, we'll never run out of stories:

A CUBAN TEEN whose parents fled in the boatlift visits Havana, learns salsa from her grandma and discovers her uncle is a famous local musician.

THE SON OF A NIGERIAN DIPLOMAT visits Lagos, a thriving hub of African culture, and makes lasting friendships with cousins they've never met.

THE DAUGHTER OF MEXICAN IMMIGRANTS experiences the magic of the Oaxaca mountains and learns her indigenous language.

A FRENCH TEEN falls in love with Paris and her family's century-old vineyard.



Sample Episode (30-40 min)

INTRO. We meet our traveler in their U.S. home and get a glimpse of their life and family— the sweet goodbyes to their parents and siblings, their desires and hopes for their trip.

ACT I The Journey. The moments of new sights and sounds along the way to meet the extended family for the first time. The bustle of a new city or the desolation of a winding country road. And of course, the moment of meeting new family members.

ACT 2 & 3 Tailored specifically to each traveler and location. Some episodes will be culture and city-driven, some will be country living and ancestral traditions. And these differences will keep the viewer engaged, since every episode will feel like a completely unique experience.

Our young traveler returns home, shares gifts and pictures and stories with their parents, and through that exchange we get to hear in their own words what was most meaningful to them about their trip.



SPIN-OFFS:

This show has legs beyond just multiple seasons. There's the possibility of a "Nailed-It" style cookbook featuring family recipes from across the globe. Or country-specific travel guidebooks featuring tips and recommendations from our young travelers. There's educational kits to be created for teachers focusing a lesson plan on a specific episode.

And the timing couldn't be better, after life in a global shutdown, for families to reconnect and for audiences to rediscover the world all over again.
